## Transportation Safety Survey Results – City of Saint Paul - April 2024

- What Transportation Safety Issues are most important to you?
- -Speeding, blind spots at turns, ROW for Church Street and Bartlett Crossroads, use of Seat Belts.
- -Safety of the children playing and walking around
- -Improve School Area (2 people)
- -Children's safety in walking near roadways to school or the store
- -Road by Cemetery needs improvements
- Additional Lighting
- -More walkways
- -Water and drainage issues (2 people)
- -Road near residential areas are too narrow
  - Where do you see the most concern in regards to Transportation Safety?
- -Church Street and Harborview Drive needs a rail on the loop. School Road is too short. No pedestrian walkways on community roads throughout the town.
- -Road Drainage Issues (3 people)
- -Northeast Big Lake right by the lake.
- -Erosion on south side of town
- -Most of the population wear black outerwear and are hard to see at night. Need to wear reflective tape or clothing to be more visible.



- -Church Street and Harborview Drive needs road improvements (2 people)
- -School Road is too short needs to be extended.
- -No pedestrian walkways in Saint Paul these are needed
- -Erosion on road to Tolstoi Beach, road going to South Side of Island and Rec Hall Area.
- -Issues with potholes and washboard roadways.
- Improve sight lines and remove blind spots on old town roads
  - Identify any Crashes, Injuries or Transportation Safety Related incidents that you can think of or identify in the community. If possible, please provide date when transportation safety incident occurred.
- -Fork lift bumping into a vehicle by Church Street, not being able to view around the corner.
- -Tire issues due to road conditions being bad and road material being too jagged causing tires to deflate.
- -Crash by tribal building by the stop sign in past years.
- -Minor Accident in front of Tribal Office
